GROUP REPORTS

History Group Report 2016

We have continued with a monthly programme of talks and visits with a break in September, which is the month when most people seem to be away. The talks this year included Terrington Bowls Club, The Bay Horse Inn, Turnpike Roads and Migration to Canada in 18C. We visited Howsham Mill, Kirkham Abbey and the English Heritage Archaeological Store at Helmsley. There are a loyal band of attenders of about a dozen people who come to the meetings. We continue to work on additions to the database and Gerry responds to family history enquiries on Terrington Ancestors, which often come via the Church. This year a lady who is a descendant of Rev Charles Hall visited from Australia to see the Church and the old Rectory, now Terrington Hall School.
